FUTURITY WAIT **ON I WISH I WIN**

One of the headline acts for Saturday's triple Group One meeting at Caulfield is the mouthwatering clash between weight-for-age heavyweights Mr Brightside (NZ) (Bullbars) and **I Wish I Win (NZ)** (Savabeel), but trainer and co-owner Peter Moody is keeping his options open with I Wish I Win.

Moody said on Monday that while he will nominate the Group One star for Saturday's Gr.1 Futurity (1400m), he is not locked-in to running I Wish I Win in any race.

"There's a race for him from now and until the middle of June every Saturday, so he doesn't have to run unless I am happy with him," Moody said.

"I've got to be happy with the horse.

He's coming along well and he'll gallop in the morning (Tuesday) and we'll see how he goes and take it from there."

The stable is reluctant to run I Wish I Win on firm ground and so the Melbourne forecast for the week will be monitored closely. There is no rain predicted in the Victorian capital until possibly Saturday, with 38 degrees forecast for race day and Friday also expected to be dry with a top of 32.

If I Wish I Win does contest the Futurity and run as well as he seemingly always does, the \$2.5 million All-Star Mile (1600m) on March 8 – where he would again clash with Mr Brightside – could loom as a second-up target.

I Wish I Win and Mr Brightside are among Australasia's all-time leading

money earners, with I Wish I Win boasting earnings of A\$12.7m from 24 starts while Mr Brightside has collected A\$16.5m from 41 starts.

They have only clashed once in the past and that was 18 months ago when Mr Brightside won the Gr.1 Memsie Stakes (1400m), with I Wish I Win finishing strongly for third, just half a length from the winner.

The Sportsbet market suggests I Wish I Win could be Mr Brightside only genuine Futurity rival, with \$1.80 bet about the Lindsay Park-trained star and I Wish I Win at \$4.50. There is a margin then to the next line at \$10, occupied by the Godolphin pair Tom Kitten (Harry Angel) and Pericles (Street Boss).

EMBELLISH 4YO HEADLINES MEMORABLE DAY FOR STUD

Cambridge Stud was in the thick of the action at Matamata with a hat-trick of winners and also made an impression further afield.

The premier nursery's graduates were led by stakes victor **What You Wish For (NZ)** (Embellish), while **Balance Of Power (NZ)** (Almanzor) and **Moschino (NZ)** (Ten Sovereigns) starred on the undercard.

In Australia, resident stallion Almanzor was represented by stakes winner **Rise At Dawn (NZ)** (Almanzor) and the farm also enjoyed success in Hong Kong, with veteran **Gallant Crown (NZ)** (Hallowed Crown) adding

to his tally at Sha Tin.

What You Wish For is a son of Embellish and opened his winning black-type account when triumphant in the Listed Kaimai Stakes (2000m).

The Mark Walker and Sam Bergerson-trained representative joined Hitabell (NZ), Bold Soul (NZ) and the stud-raced Luberon (NZ) as stakes winners produced by the Group One-winning son of Savabeel.

"Embellish has had a fantastic summer and it was a great result, especially for Te Akau who raced Embellish and have been such big supporters of him," said Scott Calder,

Cambridge Stud's Head of Sales and Nominations.

What You Wish For is the first foal of the Smart Missile mare Grand Wish and was a \$60,000 New Zealand Bloodstock National Yearling Sale buy for Te Akau's David Ellis who also secured her unraced half-sister, Wish Come True (NZ), by Savabeel for \$190,000.

Their dam is a half-sister to the Gr.1 Galaxy Handicap (1100m) winner Griante (Good Journey), who was raced by her trainer David Brideoake with Brendan and Jo Lindsay.

Grand Wish has a yearling son by

Sword Of State, produced a sister to What You Wish For last season and is back in foal to Embellish.

“The Sword Of State colt will be part of the NZB Online Yearling Sale so he’s had a big boost,” Calder said.

Meanwhile, What You Wish For’s stablemate Balance Of Power, an Almanzor four-year-old, was also secured at Karaka by Ellis for \$300,000.

He now has three career victories to his credit and a runner-up finish in the Listed Challenge Stakes as a juvenile.

Balance Of Power is the first foal of the Power mare Respin (NZ), successful in an edition of the Listed Inglewood Stakes, and his brother

was sold to trainers Gerald Ryan and Sterling Alexiou and Andrew Williams Bloodstock at Karaka last year for \$260,000.

“The mare has a yearling filly by Almanzor and had a filly by Satono Aladdin last season and is in foal to Chaldean,” Calder said.

Moschino is trained by Margaret Falconer and raced under her Ellesmere Thoroughbreds banner, and following six placings has now won her last two starts.

Moschino is a daughter of Ten Sovereigns and the Stravinsky mare Botanic (NZ) and was purchased via the Gavelhouse platform for \$2700.

The dam is a half-sister to the South African stakes winner Diamond King (NZ) (More Than Ready) and since Moschino, has produced a pair of fillies by Sword Of State and is back in foal to the Snitzel stallion.

Rise At Dawn, who was bred by Monovale Holdings, won Saturday’s Listed The Elms Handicap (1400m) to earn the Lindsay Park-trained representative a spot in the Gr.1 All Star Mile (1600m).

“He has gone through the grades and has had eight wins from 13 starts and just puts himself in his races and takes bad luck out of the equation,” Calder said.

Cambridge Stud’s weekend was crowned at Sha Tin on Sunday evening when graduate Gallant Crown posted his eighth victory.

The David Hayes-trained eight-year-old was initially purchased at Karaka for \$40,000 by Mark Forbes’ Kiltannon Stables and was later passed in at the Ready to Run Sale.

He was a trial winner at Ruakaka for Forbes as a three-year-old and subsequently sold to Hong Kong interests.

The gelding is a son of Hallowed Crown and the Stravinsky mare Justagem (NZ), who has a Sword Of State yearling, and her half-sister Penny Gem (NZ) (Pentire) won the G1 Captain Cook Stakes.

VALACHI LEGACY LIVING ON IN STAR FILLY

Kevin Hickman has left a lasting mark on New Zealand's breeding industry, with the recent success of sensational filly **Pivotal Ten (NZ)** (Ten Sovereigns) an embodiment of his vision at Valachi Downs.

A daughter of Ten Sovereigns, Pivotal Ten has been unbeaten in her last five starts for trainer-jockey Samantha Wynne, including victories in the Listed NZB Insurance Stakes (1400m), Listed Gore Guineas (1335m) and Listed Southland Guineas (1400m). At Gore, her nearest rival was six lengths away, while she was simply flawless at Ascot Park, putting nearly nine lengths on the field in a searing time of 1.21.70.

A hugely influential figure in the South Island and domestic racing communities, Hickman sadly passed away in August last year. Gareth Downey, who was the General Manager at his stud, Valachi Downs, until its closure in 2022, takes great pride in watching Hickman's legacy live on through the filly.

"All of us that were involved in Valachi are delighted to watch how well she's going and it seems very appropriate that it's happening in the South Island, which is Kevin's homeland," Downey said.

"We have so much admiration and respect for Kevin, we all loved watching the Valachi gold racing and while she's

not carrying those colours, every time she goes around, it feels like she's got Kevin's legacy running along with her. We all get a huge amount of thrill watching that.

"I can't help but think how much he would've loved to race the filly himself, but given that she did have to be sold, the fact that she's being raced by someone like Colin (Wightman) who is an owner-breeder himself, it's great to see.

"He's having an incredible journey with her."

A product of Hickman's Waikato thoroughbred nursery, Pivotal Ten was sold through the National Weanling

Sale of 2022 to Wightman, who outlaid \$15,000 to secure her.

“She was a very attractive weanling, possibly a touch small at the time which was a family trait,” Downey said.

“You look back now and \$15,000 seems like a remarkable purchase price, I think we had 20 weanlings go through that sale and only three of them sold for less than this filly.

“She was the eighth foal out of the mare, and although there is a wonderful family behind her, people tend to go to the weanling sales for pinhook opportunities and she wasn’t an obvious commercial pinhook at the time.

“She was well-suited to Colin, who wanted to race and ultimately have the potential of breeding from her.”

Pivotal Ten was among the first southern hemisphere crop of Ten Sovereigns, a multiple-Group One winning son of No Nay Never. Owned by Coolmore, Ten Sovereigns shuttled to Valachi Downs in 2021 with U S Navy Flag, who was subsequently sold to The Oaks Stud.

“We were lucky enough to have U S Navy Flag come first, and after that venture went well, we went to Coolmore looking for another opportunity,” Downey said.

“He had all the same sort of appeal that U S Navy Flag had, a great race record, good family behind him and a lovely big type. He was a speed-oriented sire.

“The only challenge with him was that he had a remarkably similar profile to U S Navy Flag, so they did compete against each other, but he appealed to us because of the quality of his race record over there.”

Ten Sovereigns mated with a British imported-broodmare in Lady Woodcote, who while herself was unraced, is a full-sister to Maarek, winner of the Gr.1 Prix de l’Abbaye de Longchamp (1000m) among a number of other stakes victories.

“When the industry reflects on Kevin’s contribution, obviously he made an amazing contribution and he was an amazing man, but one of the things he did was bring these mares from the Northern Hemisphere into the New Zealand breeding industry,” Downey said.

“Although Lady Woodcote was unraced, having a Pivotal full-sister to a Group One winner with a lovely family behind her made her the kind of mare

that Kevin was looking to try and bring down.

“The various family members that have descended from her can now continue that legacy for a long time.”

Of Lady Woodcote’s other progeny to race, four have been winners, including Woodcote Lass (NZ) (Showcasing), who was placed in the Listed Canterbury Belle Stakes (1200m).

The mare was sold through Valachi’s dispersal sale in 2022 and purchased by Murray Bloodstock, where she was then served by Tarzino, resulting in a colt that was sold to Wightman and GB Bloodstock for \$18,000 at the National Weanling Sale last June.

MONAGHAN BOY BRINGS UP MILESTONE FOR TYLER

Kelvin Tyler ticked off another milestone in his training career at Ascot Park on Saturday, bringing up his 400th winner with progressive gelding **Monaghan Boy (NZ)** (Ghibellines).

The Riverton-based horseman has been a prominent figure in the South Island racing scene for well over a decade, while also successfully campaigning horses such as Lightning Jack (NZ) (Per Incanto), Lady Sass (NZ) (Staphanos), Master Marko (NZ) (Contributer) and Prince Alby (NZ) (Sacred Falls) in the north in recent seasons.

Closer to home, Tyler had a big team of runners engaged on Southland Guineas Day and secured

a winning double, bringing up the 400th domestic success with the first of those in Monaghan Boy. A gelding by Ghibellines, Monaghan Boy had been lightly-raced with just eight starts under his belt, the most recent of those coming the previous weekend at Wingatui where he finished seventh behind Cherryville (NZ) (Ghibellines).

Coming back to his favoured 1400m range, Monaghan Boy looked a big danger under a featherlight 52.5kg and hit the lead at the top of the straight, never being headed to score by three-quarters of a length to Whiny Meow (NZ) (Iffraaj).

Tyler had been confident of a bold showing and was rapt with the performance.

"I thought he came into the race really well, he had a nice claimer on his back and had 52.5kg," Tyler said. "I think he likes the tighter turning track and at 1400m, I thought he'd be quite hard to beat.

"Originally I was going to try and qualify him for the ODT Southern Mile Final, but I think the mile seems to undo him a little bit. There is a nice 1400m on that day, so he'll come into that nicely as well I think."

The victory was Monaghan Boy's third in nine starts, earning over \$67,000 for the Carriers Arms Racing Syndicate.

Two races later, Tyler was back in the winner's circle with **Quick Call (NZ)**

(Turn Me Loose), who bounced back into winning form at the right time in the \$50,000 Rating 65 contest. The daughter of Turn Me Loose had been badly hampered in a fall last-start and entered Saturday's race a \$20 chance, but she defied those odds with a gusty effort to score by a length to Float (NZ) (Ghibellines).

"She works very well but has probably been racing slightly below average, she's only a wee thing to be honest," Tyler said. "But, I've got her up over ground and she seemed to grow another leg.

"Two starts ago, she was unfortunately hooked up in a fall, so I couldn't really knock her for that. She did surprise me a bit on Saturday, to be stuck three-wide like that and still winning was an unbelievable run."

Tyler was equally pleased for apprentice jockey Abdul Najib, who partnered both Quick Call and Monaghan Boy to victory.

"He tries really hard and has a great mannerism, I love supporting these apprentices and giving them a shot," Tyler said.

"I just tell them to go out there and do their best, if it doesn't work out then there is always another day. We always go out with a Plan A, but if they need to change something, so be it and I'll support them."

Quick Call races in the well-recognised colours of Terry Lines, a key supporter of the Tyler stable.

While he may not have realised the milestone was approaching, Tyler was pleasantly surprised to be told on a feature day for the region.

"I'm not big on records really, if someone didn't tell me I probably wouldn't have known, but it's quite a privilege," he said. "That's quite a few winners.

"I'm always looking to my next one not my last one, but it's an honour so hopefully we can keep ticking away and get a few more.

"It was a great day, I walked the track on Friday night and I thought it was closer to a (Soft) 6 than a 5, which I believe they need to be at this time

of the year. It started as a 5 and ended up a (Good) 4, it was good, safe racing. Horses were coming from all over the track, it played fair and that's all you want."

NICCONI COUNTY ON THE BOARD IN NEW ZEALAND

Former Hong Kong galloper **Nicconi County** (Nicconi) saluted for the first time since arriving on Kiwi soil at Matamata on Saturday.

The son of Nicconi was bred in Australia and had one run in his homeland under the name of Silent Theory, finishing second in the Listed Without Fear Stakes (1050m) at Morphettville. He was then sold to Hong Kong, going on to win three races and HK\$4.7 million in the care of Caspar Fownes.

A long-standing association between Fownes and Bob Vance brought Nicconi County to New Zealand, following in the footsteps of Group One winner Royal Performer (Medicean) and a number of other imports.

After a couple of runs to build fitness, Nicconi County showed his ability with a solid last-start fourth behind Miss Rockette (NZ) (El Roca), indicating he would be a key player in the Price Racing 1400 on Matamata's feature day. In the hands of apprentice jockey Triston Moodley, Nicconi County bounced the gates well and found a handy position on the fence behind

pacemaker Strange Love (NZ) (Rock 'n' Pop).

Strange Love showed a good kick on the corner but Nicconi County was right on her heels, ranging up to the leader at the 200m and finding the winning advantage to score by a long neck.

Vance, who trains in partnership with his wife Jenny at Ardmore Lodge, was pleased to see the gelding perform up to his Hong Kong credentials.

"It was the first time he's actually had a decent draw, so I think that made a big difference," he said.

"It took him a little while to adjust to life here being in a paddock, he put on a bit of condition and life was a bit too good for him. It's taken him about four runs and he dropped down to 65 as well, but now that he's fit, I think he can go on with it.

"He had a slight ligament injury but he seems to have gotten over that here, being in a paddock certainly has helped. That was the only problem he had, his form coming out of Hong Kong was good and he had a win and couple of seconds in his last few starts there.

"He'll be up in 75 again now, so we'll probably look for a 1400m in that grade. It's interesting to note that he never raced past 1200m in Hong Kong, but the way he races, the 1400 seems to be a good distance for him.

"It's great that he's got another string to his bow and can get out to that distance."

A former top jockey, Vance rode a number of winners in Hong Kong for Fownes' father Lawrie, sparking a friendship spanning over three decades.

"I used to ride for Caspar's father when I was up there, we've known each other for 30-40 years now," Vance said. "I really only get them from him and he only really sends me the ones that are going to stand up to racing and have some petrol left in the tank.

"We've had a lot of horses from Hong Kong, including Royal Performer who won the Herbie Dyke (Gr.1, 2000m). Not all of them have been capable of winning here, but the majority of them can and have done well."

Perfect Dividends (Overshare), another horse the Vance's received out of Hong Kong, continued his good form with a second placing behind Beast Of Burden (NZ) (Turn Me Loose) in the Rich Hill Stud 1200.

SPEED TEST FOR JIMMYSSTAR

The barnstorming first-up win in the spring of **Jimmystar (NZ)** (Per Incanto) has stuck firmly in the mind of trainer Ciaron Maher, who intends sending the highly talented galloper fresh into Saturday's Gr.1 Oakleigh Plate.

While conceding the 1100-metre journey at Caulfield might not appear to best suit his fast-finisher, Maher pointed to his first-up run in September over the same course when he somehow managed to get his nose in front on the line in a BM100 after giving up a huge lead.

"It's a good kick-off for him," Maher said of the Oakleigh Plate. "He's a horse who's rating is up now (103) and it's a handicap. He's won there over the trip.

"He has prepped up really well and I think he will improve again off his last prep.

"I just think its good start point timing-wise.

"He is proven over that trip and he's come up really well. He'll be getting home when the race seems all over and we'll just see how that works.

"It's as short as he wants but a big field, open handicap, it could play out his way."

If he is to win the Oakleigh Plate, one of the horses that he will have to pass in the home straight will be the well-fancied stablemate Estriella (I Am Invincible), who has been trained slightly differently this campaign.

In her two trials at Cranbourne so far, she has departed from her usual pattern of using her early speed, with Maher asking his riders to let her take a sit.

"She trialled very good the other day," Maher said. "It depends on how the race shapes as to what we will do but with a bit of cover, she certainly trialled well doing that."

Attention aiming for Guineas

Co-trainer Mick Price believes three-year-old colt **Public Attention (NZ)** (Written Tycoon) had taken his game to the next level, so he wasn't surprised with his authoritative first-up win in the Gr.3 Eskimo Prince Stakes (1200m) at Rosehill.

"It confirmed my opinion that he had physically improved from the spring to the autumn," Price said.

"I thought that his work and trials said he had matured, and the addition of blinkers also played a part, and that's how he raced," he said.

"He had a little think about it a furlong out, but he picked himself back up and he was really good I thought."

Public Attention was having only his fifth start and was first-up after finishing fifth in the Caulfield Guineas.

Price said the aim for the son of Written Tycoon was to win a Group One race.

Price and Michael Kent Junior are training Public Attention from their Rosehill stables and he will start at the track in the Gr.2 Hobartville Stakes (1400m) on Saturday.

"It's a Group Two and then it's into the Gr.1 Randwick Guineas. That's what we're trying to do and that's win a Group One with him." - **Racing.com**

NOBLE KNIGHT TOO TOUGH IN INVERCARGILL GOLD CUP

Battle-hardened stayer **Noble Knight (NZ)** (Ghibellines) is set to deal to some unfinished business in Dunedin after digging deep to take out the Baillie & Lewis Pharmacy Invercargill Gold Cup (2600m) at Ascot Park on Saturday.

The \$60,000 race was the first Cup win for the seven-year-old, who has previously competed with credit in staying features on both sides of the Tasman.

Noble Knight was beaten by two necks when he finished third in the Listed Dunedin Gold Cup (2400m) at Wingatui last summer. Since then he has run fifth in the Gr.3 New Zealand Cup (3200m) at Riccarton and a solid eighth in the Listed Pakenham Cup (2500m) in Victoria.

Noble Knight warmed up for the Invercargill Gold Cup with a close fifth in the Marlborough Cup (2000m) at Riccarton on January 25, and he clearly relished the step up to 2600m on Saturday.

The Invercargill Gold Cup became a true test of stamina, with Mahoe (NZ) (Alamosa) setting a fast pace through the first half of the race before The Tui Toiler (NZ) (Highly Recommended) worked forward and took over down the back straight. Those efforts took their toll as that pair eventually dropped out to finish last and second-last.

That was an ideal scenario for Noble Knight, who settled into a smooth rhythm in sixth spot, one off the rail. Jockey Billy Jacobson allowed his mount to stride forward coming down the side of the track, surging past a tiring The Tui Toiler just before the home turn.

Theoden (NZ) (Proisir) went with Noble Knight and appeared to get his head in front early in the straight, but Noble Knight summoned another big effort to claw his way back in front and win by a head.

Noble Knight has now had 47 starts for seven wins, 13 seconds, six thirds and \$292,174 in stakes. The Invercargill Gold Cup broke something of a win drought for the Ghibellines

gelding, whose previous victory was in the Grand Casino (2200m) at Wingatui in December of 2023.

“That was a very good, tough win today,” trainer and part-owner Sandy Cunningham said. “Even though he hadn’t won a race for a while, he’s just such a consistent horse and he’s been racing so well all the way through.”

Cunningham is now keen to go back to Wingatui and attempt to go two better in the Positive Signs + Print Dunedin Gold Cup. That 2400m feature will be one of three black-type races staged during the inaugural Otago Classics Day on March 1.

“We’ll go to the Dunedin Gold Cup again now,” Cunningham said. “He ran a really close third in the race last year, and we’re pretty keen to go back and have another crack at it.”

STELLAR RUN CONTINUES FOR THE GOOD SHEPHERD

The Good Shepherd's (NZ) (Power) stellar run of form continued at Ascot Park on Saturday, powering through late to win the Cruickshank Pryde Southland Stakes (1200m) for Lee Callaway.

A seven-year-old by Power, The Good Shepherd was trained by his owner, Stephen Blair-Edie, until April last year, when he handed over the reins to Callaway. The gelding had previously shown a liking to soft track conditions, but through the current term, has been a model of consistency on top of the ground, including an impressive win at Wingatui in mid-January.

Callaway took an opportunity to test The Good Shepherd in stakes company in the Listed Hazlett Stakes last Saturday, where he finished a game sixth from a wide trip. Backing up in the \$50,000 contest, the gelding was underrated in the market at \$11, with his near-topweight decreased by Ruvanesh Muniandy's three-kilogram claim.

The Good Shepherd, Rochello (NZ) (Highly Recommended) and race-favourite Tikki (NZ) (Per Incanto) jumped in unison before Muniandy allowed him to settle back in the one-one, sitting outside of The Radiant One (NZ) (Darci Brahma). Having been taken on throughout, Tikki began to tire half-way down the straight while The Good Shepherd and The Radiant One hunted her down, with the former finding the edge at the line to win by a head.

Callaway, a jockey who happily watched trackside on this occasion, couldn't have been prouder of his stable star.

"He's been racing really well and I was very impressed with the run yesterday, he jumped out well and it was a great ride by Ruvanesh," he said.

"He's usually got the top weight and while he continues to, I'll keep the claim on. In saying that, Ruvanesh gets on very well with this horse and was just unlucky the start before, being caught wide. He still went a great race.

"He used to like the wet tracks and he seems to prefer running on top of the ground now, which is good.

"There is an open 1200 at Wingatui in two weeks' time, so I'll see how he goes there, then he may have a wee break."

Callaway was equally pleased to deliver the victory for a good friend in Blair-Edie, who he rode over 20 winners for whilst the Riverton horseman was training.

"I've always gotten along really well with Steve Blair-Edie, I've ridden quite a few winners for him so it means a lot to be able to get a couple of horses to train for him," Callaway said.

"Claudius Maximus ran second as well yesterday, so he's another that is

performing quite well which is great. Steve always looked after me and supported me, so it's awesome to get some good results for him."

Purchased for just \$9,000 at the Karaka May Sale in 2018, The Good Shepherd is fashioning an enviable record, winning nine races with earnings of over \$230,000.

He was the second foal out of handy race-mare Likeapins (NZ) (Pins), who won 11 races and was placed at Listed level. The mare's other progeny to race have all been winners, including Whiskey (NZ) (Burgundy), who placed in the Gr.3 Bonecrusher Stakes (1400m).

BIG JOURNEY PAYS OFF FOR WAVERLEY MARE

Steal My Thunder (NZ) (Derryn) was a long way from home at Ascot Park on Saturday, but that didn't stop the mare from taking home the major spoils in the ODT Southern Mile Qualifier – Summer Cup (1600m).

The daughter of Derryn is trained at Waverley by Bill Thurlow, who identified next month's \$200,000 ODT Southern Mile Final (1600m) as a possible target for the mare after a convincing last-start win at her local course. Needing maximum points to be in contention for the final field, Steal My Thunder crossed the Cook Strait and headed for Southland's feature meeting, where she was rated a \$6.30 second-favourite for the race behind Treybon (NZ) (Sweynesse) (\$5.50).

Jumping from the extreme outside barrier, Steal My Thunder worked forward early under Ashvin Goindasamy, who found good positioning three pairs back outside of Treybon. Cheney (NZ) (Vespa) headed to the front along the back stretch and made it a truly-run contest, leading to the home turn before a wall of horses fanned across the Ascot Park straight.

Steal My Thunder had good momentum and hit the lead at the 150m, fighting on bravely to draw clear of Treybon and a game Cheney, winning by 1 – ¼ lengths.

Thurlow was rapt with the performance, praising Goindasamy's effort from an awkward draw.

"Her run was very good, she did everything we could ask of," Thurlow said.

"She left here in great order and travelled down well, then she was very well ridden on Saturday by the boy from that gate."

While Steal My Thunder receives 10 points for winning the race, the

competitive nature of the ODT series may mean she still misses a start on March 1.

"The motivation for sending her down was trying to possibly get into the ODT Final at Wingatui in two weeks' time," Thurlow said. "She needed maximum points to get in there and she got that yesterday winning, but at this stage, she may still struggle to get in.

"There has been a lot of qualifying races and she may not make the field, so it was a bit of a punt. She may not get in, but she's still won a nice \$50,000 race so there is no downside to it at all.

"If she doesn't make that field, she will run in the 1400 on that day and head home."

The victory was Thurlow's 26th of the season, and while he had success over Cup Week at Riccarton, it was his first time racing in the deep south.

"I haven't raced a horse down there before, it's a pretty long way from home," he said. "She left here on

Tuesday and got there on Thursday, Ellis Winsloe very kindly looked after her for me.

"It was great that it all panned out in the end, I'll be heading down for Wingatui."

Bred by Grangewilliam Stud, Steal My Thunder is part-owned by farm owner Mark Corcoran, who stands Derryn. She is the second foal out of a Per Incanto mare Frequente (NZ), a half-sister to Justaskme (NZ) (No Excuse Needed), who was placed at Group One level and earned over \$545,000.

MOSCHINO MAKING HER MARK FOR FALCONER

Promising filly **Moschino (NZ)** (Ten Sovereigns) put together two victories in quick succession on Saturday at Matamata, winning the Ancroft Developments (1400m).

The daughter of Ten Sovereigns had been placed in the first four on six occasions before breaking her maiden at Te Rapa on January 31, making her a key player in the MAAT contest worth \$40,000. Michael McNab, who went on to ride a treble at the meeting, retained the ride on Moschino for the race and looked in control from the outset, settling in the one-one with Oppenheimer (NZ) (Belardo) in the pacemaking role.

Moschino was tracking beautifully into the straight and ranged up to the leaders at the 150m, showing plenty of ability to hold off favoured runners Amyer Star (NZ) (Almanzor) and Cypher (NZ) (Darci Brahma) and win by a long neck.

The filly is trained by Cambridge horsewoman Margaret Falconer, who has always held her in high regard.

“We’ve always really like this filly, she’s just taken a little while to learn,” she said.

“I think her run at Te Rapa gave her a lot of confidence, it

was Michael’s first ride on her that day and he had a bit of a plan on how to ride her yesterday, it all came together very well.”

While Moschino won’t have too much more asked of her in her three-year-old term, Falconer has identified the Windsor Park Stud 3YO Trophy (1500m) on Champions Day at Ellerslie as a possible target.

“She won’t do too much more for the season, but I think we will aim for the three-year-old race on Champions Day,” she said.

“I think a step-up in trip will be good for her, and if that field looks suitable, we’ll probably go there.”

Falconer races Moschino under her Ellesmere Thoroughbreds banner, having purchased the filly for \$2,700 through gavelhouse.com in March of 2023. Bred by Cambridge Stud, Moschino’s grand-dam is Salsa (NZ) (O’Reilly), who placed in the Gr.1 New Zealand Thoroughbred Breeders’ Stakes (1600m) and was a stakes winner in Australia for the stable.

“We raced her grandmother, who was Group One-placed for

us and won a Listed race in Australia,” Falconer said. “That attracted us to her, we wanted to get back in the family.

“She’s been given time to develop and is a lovely big filly now, she should only keep developing nicely from here.”
