**Re: Arbella Rodriguez Marquez (A#232-506-464)
Letter of Support Urging the Expeditious Approval of Humanitarian Parole**

Dear Acting Supervising Officer or Director Whom It May Concern:

We, the undersigned members of the Arizona Legislature, respectfully submit this letter in support of community member Arbella Rodriguez Marquez, who remains detained at the Eloy Detention Center. **We urge that Arbella's humanitarian parole request be expeditiously approved.**

It has become abundantly clear that Arbella is not receiving adequate care. Her medical condition has worsened while she has been detained at the Eloy Detention Center. Arbella's legal counsel initially submitted sworn statements supporting Arbella's deteriorating conditions, covering hematemesis, bleeding, bruising, lymph-node swelling, weight loss, anemia, and joint pain.

Since the initial request, Arbella's condition has *worsened* with conditions including:

- Progression of symptoms in the initial request (additional weight loss, hematemesis, and persistent anemia),
- Acute hospitalization for confirmed lymphadenopathy and mild anemia,
- New diagnoses with rheumatoid arthritis along with an evaluation now required, and
- Specialist ongoing monitoring care is necessary due to potential flares of her autoimmune condition.

The Eloy Detention Center is not equipped to properly care for Arbella's conditions. Arbella has no criminal history, is not a danger to the community, and certainly not a flight risk. She must be released so she can pursue proper and life-saving medical care. For Arbella to remain at the Eloy Detention Center, with documented evidence of worsening serious medical conditions, along with a history of leukemia, is a death sentence.

Additionally, Arbella remains detained in a facility known for its inhumane treatment of migrants, egregious denial of basic health care, and sanctioned harassment of LGBTQ+ detainees.

We urge you to approve Arbella's repeated requests for Humanitarian Parole so she may obtain proper medical care and continue with all legal proceedings. Any additional delay places her health and life at significant risk.






