2026 (ahead)	Cannabis hospitality and broader medical / adult-use cleanup remain on the table. Jul 2025	Illinois launched Metrc as the statewide cannabis seed-to-sale tracking platform.	Implemented.	Operators had to transition inventory, reporting, and training workflows to a new system.	Implementation - not a new bill
Jan-Aug 2024	Illinois updated the operating environment in two ways: Smoke Free Act changes took effect on 1/1/24 for locally authorized on-site consumption settings, and adult-use administrative rules took effect on 8/20/24.	Enacted and implemented.	Created a clearer local path for certain consumption spaces and added more mature rules for licensing, inventory, ownership changes, renewals, and training.	Local ordinances rule updates
Dec 2021	Public Act 102-0690 modernized Illinois hemp law, better aligned it with the federal / USDA framework, broadened the hemp definition, and updated licensing and rulemaking language.	Enacted.	Gave the hemp market a more durable statutory foundation and clarified IDOA's role.	Monitor future conforming changes
Aug 2019 - Jan 2020	Illinois made medical cannabis permanent in August 2019, then allowed adult-use sales to start on 1/1/20.	Enacted and implemented.	Locked in the medical program while opening the commercial adult-use market statewide.	n/a
Jun 2019	Public Act 101-0027, the Cannabis Regulation and Tax Act, legalized adult-use cannabis for adults 21+ and created the licensing, tax, and regulatory structure.	Enacted.	Established the core architecture for dispensaries, cultivators, taxes, social equity, and agency oversight.	Rulemaking and later cleanup bills
Aug 2018	Illinois enacted the Industrial Hemp Act and also created the Opioid Alternative Pilot Program for medical cannabis access.	Enacted.	Opened the modern hemp licensing framework and expanded medical access beyond traditional qualifying-condition pathways.	n/a
2015	The Industrial Hemp Pilot Program became effective in Illinois law for research and higher-education cultivation.	Effective.	Started Illinois hemp policy before the later commercial licensing model.	n/a
2013 - 2014	Illinois enacted the Compassionate Use of Medical Cannabis Pilot Program Act in 2013; the medical program took effect on 1/1/14.	Enacted, then effective.	Created the state's first legal cannabis market and patient access pathway.	n/a
