LAKE MOUNTAIN Nov. 7

GRAVES PEAK Nov. 26-28

If you park your car at the twin bridges over Crooked Fork and White Sand which join at that point to form the Lochsa River;; if you then park your pack on your back and your feet on your skis; if you then hike past the parked skyline and log loader and continue up, up, up the road to Kube Park; you can then park your tired carcass in the tent and enjoy the solitude of the Idaho high country. And with some luck on the weather you can work out the kinks with some moonlight skiing just outside camp in preparation for the next mornings assault on Graves Peak, an old lookout site about a mile inside the wilderness. However, be prepared also for some mighty brisk winds, windpacked snow and a challenging scramble up the last 300 feet over some car sized boulders. (20% of the party failed this last challenge). This was a surprisingly fine hike organized by a Mountaineer alum-pres., and is moderate to occasionally strenuous as three day trips go. We speculate that after a little more snow conditions the road there is probably some snowmobile traffic, at least on weekends.






